PRESIDENTS REPORT – DENNIS FILLMORE

Senate bills to allow PGC and PFC to set their own license fees Passed the Senate (47 to 2), and went to the House for vote. Bills to give the HTE instructors there Hunting license for \$1.00 for their volunteer service, and to require schools to provide space for HTE courses. Rep. Mark Keller has introduced a bill to further strengthen PA's firearms pre-exemption statutes, preventing municipalities from enacting their own local firearm ordinances, passed out of committee, should be voted on in the house. Kids Fishing Derby this Saturday, Club grounds closed till 4pm. Work party the same day to work on the outside ranges, feel free to come out to help. Second Amendment rally at Capital at 10am, March 22nd in the Rotunda. Will be contacting a welder next week to finalize plan to complete indoor 22 range. There is now a Handicaped portable toilet in parking lot near the pond, it will remain. The Club's cooperative fish nursery was featured on TV.
